The New Zealand Ministry of Education in partnership with the South Australia Department for Education offers two Job Shadow placements to Principals across New Zealand where each Principal shadows the other for four weeks in their school. They spend this time seeing how the other Principal works and gaining an insight into their school, and the Education system in a different country. The New Zealand and South Australia Principals selected are to have a record of success as a school leader and an enthusiasm for furthering their own professional development.

Our Principal Jo applied and has won one of the opportunities, so will be spending 4 weeks in South Australia at the start of term 3, after which her corresponding Principal will spend 4 weeks in our school. This is a great opportunity for Jo and our school. During this time the Senior Leadership Team will cover Jo's absence, though she will only be a phone call away.

On a different note, one of the issues most frequently raised at Board meeting is related to parking, including parking on yellow lines, overstaying on the 3 minute parking designed for stop and drop, and ignoring of road cones placed by staff to ensure the safety of our School community. Teacher Paid Union Meetings

Dear Parents,

You may be aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers.

While there are many more children coming into the school system, there are not enough new teachers being trained. Urgent and significant changes are needed to ensure that the teaching profession can attract the people it needs and to ensure class sizes do not start to increase.

On Tuesday 26 June the teachers from this school will be attending a NZEI Te Riu Roa paid union meeting regarding the Kua Tae Te Wā - It's Time campaign. The campaign aims to free teachers to teach and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. The meetings will allow our teachers to discuss how the Ministry of Education has responded to changes that the union is seeking.

Our teaching staff are members of NZEI and legally entitled to attend this meeting. The teachers will be leaving school on Tuesday 26th June at 1.30pm to attend their paid union meeting which starts at 2pm.

We strongly encourage parents to make arrangements to pick their child(ren) up from school by 1.30pm on at Tuesday 26 June. If you are unable to pick your children up then, please advise us so that your children can be supervised until 3pm. Please submit the [form on this link](#) to let us know whether your child/children need to be supervised.

We appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for families. However, we encourage you to support your teachers as they strive to achieve the changes which will safeguard quality education for all children and ensure we make teaching an attractive profession for graduates.

Anyone who may need help with arrangements should contact the office.

Reporting to Parents

As we have communicated earlier this year reporting to parents this year will be in a different format. We have already run a session on this for parents but we intend to run a couple more this term as well.

The reports will be digital and once we open the parent portals, you will be able to access the information at any time you wish. The long term vision is that teachers will add the assessment information not just two times a year but ongoing throughout the year. Every

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time new information is added you will receive an email to tell you that a new post has been made.

Our teachers are busy learning the system and loading information for you at the moment - Reports will go live in Week 8 this term and Parent Teacher Interviews will be held in Week 9. You will receive more information about this closer to the time.
