Kia ora koutou e te whānau

Next Wednesday 14th February we will begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday celebrations. You will notice that the *Alleluia* and *the Gloria* are always omitted during the Mass in Lent. Lent is a season of repentance and conversion. The season lasts for 40 days and the liturgical colour used is predominantly violet, reminding us of the blood shed by Jesus during His Passion and Death.



“Ashes, distributed on Ash Wednesday are a symbol of our will to be converted and to do penance when faced with the forgiveness offered by Jesus. Ashes are made from olive branches, or branches of other trees that were blessed the previous year. The ashes are placed on the forehead with the words, “Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel”, or “Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.”

The school works on a subscription basis with SchoolDocs to maintain, update, and review our policies. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies which have been well researched and follow the Ministry of Education National Administration Guidelines. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our board of trustees has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in the review.

In this informative, entertaining presentation the audience will gain an understanding of the latest information on brain changes and hence the behaviours we observe as a child transitions through adolescence to an adult.

These seminars and workshops are for parents and professionals who are working with adolescents – school teachers and board of governors, youth workers, foster and care providers and families; corrections, Oranga Tamariki, Police, health providers and anyone else who has contact with teenagers.

Our information is entirely based on up-to-date scientific medical research. Our work is scientific and evidence based, our message is positive and is important to our whole community.

Concern about young people is not new. Each generation is known to have concern about the generation following and we are the first generation to understand the changes that happen in the brain. Recent research shows that there is a burst of neuronal activity in late childhood and adolescence that is linked with risk taking and impulsive, emotional behaviours typical of teenagers.

Consistent, nurturing and positive early experiences grow resilient, empathetic and intelligent adults. Conversely adolescents in New Zealand relative to other developed countries have a high rate of social morbidity.

Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC)

Note this is the same information as last week - thank you to those who have completed this consent form. If you have not yet completed this we would appreciate it being completed as soon as possible.

At our school, parents complete a blanket permission form at enrolment or at the start of each year, which covers almost all lower risk activities and some higher risk activities as outlined on the form.

The level of information provided to parents and requested from parents about EOTC activities is proportionate to the level of risk associated with the activity.

Separate parental consent is required for most higher risk activities and we ask for this on a case-by-case basis. Parents must submit a consent form before their child/children can participate. For certain activities, we will also notify parents about any risks we have identified.

Please complete this consent form at your earliest convenience. You will need to complete the form for each of your children attending the school.

1:1 Digital Technology Guidelines and BYOC Agreement

As you know at St Francis of Assisi all of our Year 5-8 students learn in a 1:1 Chromebook environment. We value our internet facilities and digital technologies, and the benefits they bring us in learning outcomes and the effective operation of the school. We actively encourage our students to be competent and confident in the use of digital technologies; and are aware of and able to manage the challenges and issues that go with it. These issues include safety of themselves and others, privacy, copyright, and protection of digital devices and equipment. In short, we are growing our students to make responsible choices while using digital technologies; becoming digital citizens.

Because we know this is important for us all, we ask that everyone, the staff, the students and volunteers working at the school agree to use the internet and digital technologies in a safe and responsible way by following the St Francis of Assisi School Digital Guidelines.

As all Year 6-8 students, excluding new students, have already filled out this form there is no need to complete it again. However all new students and all Year 5 students will need to complete this before going a device at school. So if you are a parent of a Year 5 student or a student new to St Francis, please take the time to read through and fill out the Digital Technologies Guidelines Google Form

Students who bring their own Chromebook to school, will also need to complete the Bring Your Own Chromebook (BYOC) Agreement. This agreement is additional to the Digital Technologies Guidelines. It refers to Chromebooks, brought to school by students, and must be signed before the student may bring their Chromebook to school.

Like the Digital Technologies Guidelines, students who have already filled out this form will not need to complete it again. However all students in Year 5-8, who are bringing their own Chromebooks, for the first time this year will need to fill out the BYOC Google Form as well.

If you are a parent of a student who is bringing their own Chromebook to school for the first time this year, please take the time to read through and fill out the BYOC Agreement.


