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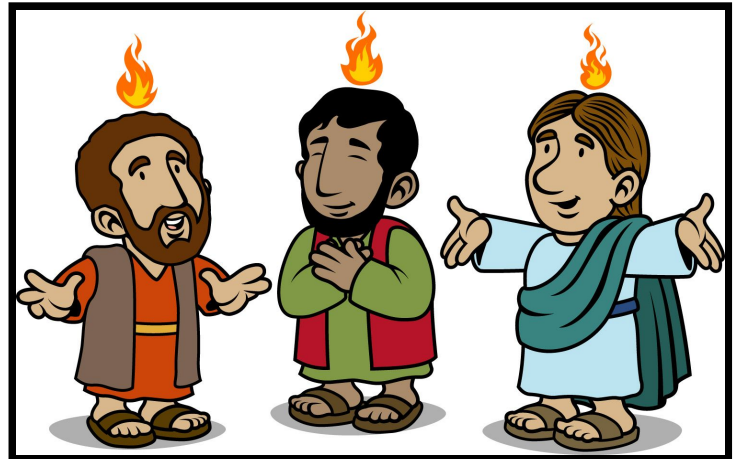
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## Kia ora koutou e te whānau

### **Board of Trustees News**

#### **Playground Installation**

Thanks to the PTA cheese roll fundraiser we are well poised to begin work on the installation of the new playground. You may have noticed that the old obstacle course was removed this week (with the help of the company who have been doing the Flockton Basin work at the back of our field - big thank you to them!). We have a project team meeting next week to begin to plan the next steps for this and we will keep you informed along the way.

#### **Block One Redevelopment**

We are getting very close to beginning the work on Block One. Block One is the block directly being the new two storey block. It has been on the list for refurbishment since we opened. Consent from council has been received and we are awaiting the tender process to finish. We don't have any dates yet however as soon as we do we will let you know. It is our intent that the classes are modernised in keeping with the other new hubs and our junior team will move into these new spaces when they are complete. We will keep you informed along the way.

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## Pastoral Care

National Administration Guideline (NAG) 2 requires the board, along with the principal and teaching staff, to maintain an ongoing programme of self-review focused on continually raising student achievement.

There are three types of review:

A **strategic** review relates mainly to the charter and includes community expectations, values, vision, and strategic aims for the next 3–5 years.

A **regular** review is cyclical, so it includes those things that occur each year, such as the budget, policy reviews, and student progress and achievement.

An **emergent** review occurs when there are unplanned issues to examine or new initiatives – for example, a change in government policy, new local initiatives, or an incident or event indicating that a current policy needs to be urgently reviewed.

Attendance Dues – DUE BY DATES. Some of you have expressed confusion as to why the parish has a due by date on our invoices.

As you are aware, the parish invoice you on behalf of the Diocese, for the Attendance Dues/Special Character Contributions for each child attending a Catholic School.

What you may not be aware of is that the parish then receives an invoice from the Diocese for approximately \$22,000 which we are required to pay by a certain date.

We put a due by date on our invoices to ensure the parish has the funds to meet the Diocesan Invoice for your children at St Francis of Assisi Catholic Primary School.

The 2017 due by dates are 20th February, 20th May, 20th August & 20th November.

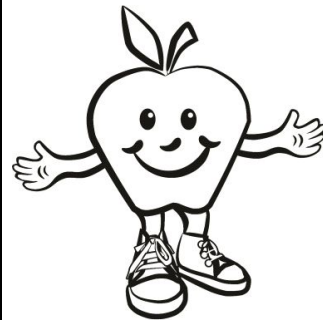
## ***Pippins***
