Cairns Conference

Whitney Hansen, Team Leader for Year 7/8 and E-Learning Co-ordinator is presenting at a conference in Cairns next week, alongside a team from the Catholic Education Office.

Their presentation is entitled: **RE Digital Resources Development - Research/Professional Learning Project** and will share the diocesan-wide (Years 7 & 8 students across 31 schools) research/ professional learning project the team has been working on. Our school has been one of the schools that has been part of the research. This research / project aims to work with current RE classroom teachers in order to assist the teaching/learning process by providing them with theologically and educationally sound digital RE resources that engage the learner. Some of year 7/8 students were interviewed for this presentation - it's great to see that our students voice will be shared with Catholic schools from all over Australia and NZ. We are very proud of Whitney's involvement with this project and wish her well for this presentation.

Parking Issues / Innes Rd and Kensington Avenue

There is no doubt about it - parking spaces are definitely at a premium on Innes Rd and Kensington Avenue. We need you all to follow the road rules in order to keep your children safe - **and** our neighbours happy.

- No driving up any of the school or parish driveways - (unless you are picking up a sick or injured child and you need to use the disability parking next to the office).
- No parking in the Parish Car park
- No parking on the shingle beside the Church and the Presbytery

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- You can not park in the 5 min drop off and walk in to pick up your child - you must stay with your car if you park there and stay no longer than 5 minutes so that others can use the space as well.
- No stopping on yellow lines - you can get a ticket even if you are still in your car on the yellow lines - as soon as you open your door a ticket can be issued.
- You must park at least one metre away from any driveway - this has been a big problem on Kensington Ave - our neighbours are unhappy that they are sometimes unable to get in or out of their driveways. Not only this - when they have approached some of our parents who are doing this - apparently our parents have been quite rude to them. We are not making friends and this is not a good look for our school. We rely on our neighbours to keep an eye on our school and we want to foster good relationships. Please be considerate.
