Complex Carb Break (Provided by School)

For Term 3 this will be fully funded by the Cluster. This means that we will provide a slice of wholemeal bread which can be eaten on its own or with butter, marmite, vegemite or peanut butter. (For some Hubs peanut butter will not be available because of allergies).
